Do you look after a campsite? Is your broom still up to the job?

If you have broken or worn-out equipment at your campsite then please go ahead and replace it – walkers will appreciate it!

Each campsite should have the following accessories:

- Bannister brush.
- Dustpan metal is recommended. They are useful for clearing out the fire pit, and metal pans are more robust to the task.
- Broom (long handle, soft bristles) for bed boards. We recommend you get one with a metal handle (or at least plastic), as we have found that wooden ones sometimes get used in the fire.
- Leaf rake also with a non-wooden handle for the same reason.
- Plastic tub for the log book, red register, some magazines and brochures. It only needs to be big enough to fit these items i.e. fairly shallow. We want to dissuade walkers from leaving food/equipment behind.
- A plastic tub for overnight storage of food to protect it from animals is not a standard campsite accessory. They have generally been provided at shelters with particular problems with rodents; sometimes by the P&WS and sometimes by the volunteers. Again, we prefer to allow minimal opportunity for walkers to leave rubbish behind. You may get one if you think it is necessary (Tip: read comments in the log book/register to see if animal scavenging has been experienced).

If you choose plastic items, please try to purchase good quality so they last as long as possible. This is the best way to reduce plastic in the environment and as waste.

- (b) supported by proof of the expenditure (e.g. receipts) showing the following -
 - the actual items purchased;
 - o the date;
 - GST if applicable
