

Managing your shelter noticeboard

The shelter noticeboard is the location for primary information for walkers. The new style of noticeboard integrated with the “Code of the Campsite” sign (right) was gradually rolled out to every shelter from mid-2020.

Only material bearing the BTF or DBCA/Parks and Wildlife Service logo should be found in the noticeboard. There should be no private advertising material displayed in the noticeboard (or in the register box, toilet, etc.); promotion of private business is not permitted at facilities (such as Track campsites) managed by the DBCA. Please remove and take away any such material as you would other inappropriate material often found in the register box.



Campfire ban notices are provided and managed by the P&WS District offices; they are sometimes turned over and/or slipped behind other notices when not required to be displayed.

There should always be a notice provided by the Foundation, including messages about supporting the Foundation and registering End-to-Ends. The design changes periodically, but the content is consistent. Please let us know if you need a new copy.

Notices should be arranged neatly but do not need to be fixed to the backing corflute. Velcro spots/sticky tape loops may be used but are not standard or expected. Please **DO NOT** use drawing pins as they promote disintegration of the corflute.

The new sign includes a request for walkers to fill in the green log book. The previous versions placed in the noticeboard will therefore be phased out and can be removed only once the new sign is installed.

Each edge of the noticeboard has two sections, with the inner section hinged. To access the notices, each edge of the noticeboard can be folded back to release the Perspex.
