

Campsite Maintenance Know-How

Printed resources

Among the resources in the book box in your campsite should be a 'Flora and Fauna Factsheets' bundle, and an Indigenous Cultural Interpretation booklet.

Other printed resources usually installed at each campsite are:

- The other contents of the book box... log book (green), register (red journal), BTF brochures, back issues of Bibbulmun News. Refer to the factsheets **Book Boxes** and **Magazines for campsites** for more details.
- A laminated notice (in the noticeboard) encouraging walkers to support the Track and the Foundation. The design is refreshed periodically. Refer to the factsheet **Noticeboard Management** for more details, including printed resources provided and managed by PWS.

Flora and Fauna Factsheets

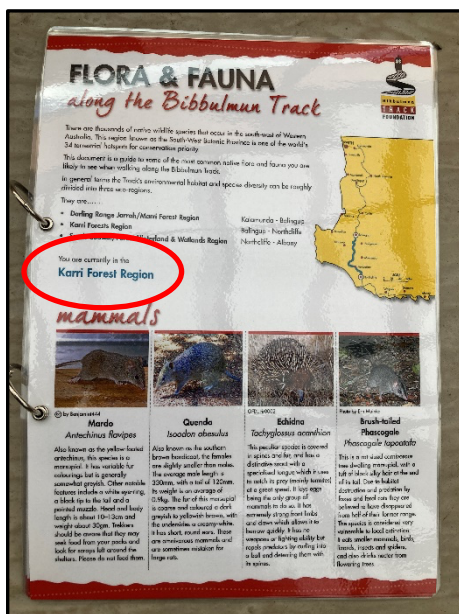
These natural history factsheets are laminated and bundled using clip rings (4 pages, double sided). They cover mammals, birds, flora (trees and wildflowers), reptiles, other fauna (frogs, insects, spiders) and fungi, and bush tucker.

There are actually three different versions of the factsheets. Each version features different species of animals, plants, etc., depending on the local ecology:

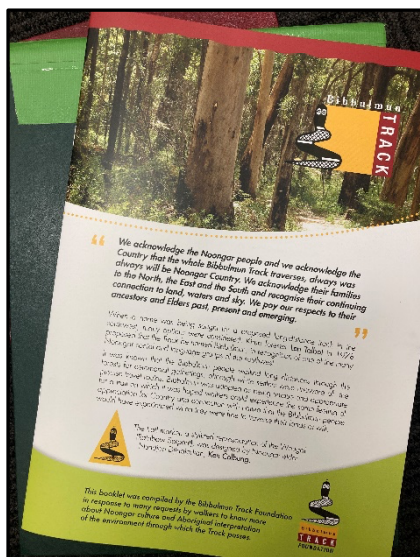
- Darling Range Jarrah/Marri Forest Region
- Karri Forest Region
- South Coastal, Forest Hinterland and Wetlands Region

You should check that your campsite has the most appropriate version!
